**Friday, October 12, 2012:** Departing Michigan today we travel through Canada (proper I.D. is required) to New York State, accommodations this evening are in Utica.

**Saturday, October 13, 2012:** After an included **continental breakfast** we depart for New Bedford MA which sits on the coast, upon arrival we enjoy the **Whaling Museum** before checking into our hotel. The museum's 107-old history was established by the Old Dartmouth Historical Society "to create and foster an interest in the history of Old Dartmouth (now the City of New Bedford, Acushnet, Dartmouth, Fairhaven and Westport, MA). This area incorporates more than 185 square miles with a population exceeding 180,000. This is not just a museum about whaling the collections include objects across a broad range of categories: fine and decorative art; folk art; photography; domestic artifacts; that represent the history of technology and industry; books, manuscripts, maps and charts, ethnographic materials, clothing and textiles, and extensive personal, business, and financial records. This is a very diverse and rich social history collection.

**Sunday, October 14, 2012:** This morning after our **continental breakfast** we depart via ferry to Martha's Vineyard, today will include and **island tour** with time for lunch and shopping on the Island. Accommodations this evening will be in Hyannis MA located on Cape Cod, overlooking the harbor.

**Monday, October 15, 2012:** **Breakfast** is included before we travel up the arm of the cape to Provincetown, MA making stops along the way. Enjoy this quaint town with restaurants and shops. Get some bargains at "the end of season" sales. On route back to mid-cape we stop at a locally winery. **Dinner** is included on our way back to our motel.

**Tuesday, October 16, 2012:** **Breakfast** is included then there are still sights to visit on the Cape before departing this morning. First stop will be at Veterans Park which overlooks Hyannis Harbor, showcases the Korean War Memorial and Kennedy Memorial. Next (providing availability) we visit St. Francis Xavier the "home" church of the Kennedy Family a docent will give you the history of the church as well as answer any questions you may have. A stop at Pairpoint Glass which has been in the glass business since 1837, is also on the agenda today. Accommodations this evening will be in the Springfield, MA area.

**Wednesday, October 17, 2012:** Today will be a wonderful day, we take a cruise on the Hudson River, this river is famous for the rich and famous as well as it's beauty especially during the fall color season. Accommodations will be in Oneonta, NY.

**Thursday, October 18, 2012:** Homeward bound, after our included **breakfast** we again cross through Canada to the Blue Water Bridge and our home towns. As we travel we think about all the new sights we have seen in a familiar location, can't wait for 2013!!!
